Wonderful things have been happening to Grace Center in 2009! We thought you might be interested in some of our wonderful blessings we have had. We know we can't cover them all, space won't allow it. Here are just a few.

Earlier this year, The Bloomington Daughter's of Revolution, a not-for-profit organization, learned about the work of Grace Center and decided to do something to contribute to our work. These young ladies, whose mission is dedicated to social change, organized a benefit bash. To everyone's surprise- they raised \$1000.00! They have also been volunteering at the last few of our Community Dinners. What a blessing!

In March, Indian Creek Fire Fighters showed up at our door with 71 rolls of toilet paper. This is an item we welcomed to our dwindling

stock!

One Monday morning in April, when volunteers were delivering food to the Food Pantry, they found a shelf broken and food on the floor. On Tuesday morning, as volunteers were cleaning up the Monday mess and preparing to open the Food Pantry, two more shelves broke! Ken and Deb Simmerman stepped in and donated funds for 2 new steel commercial shelves! Unknown to them, Grace Center had recently planned to begin replacing shelves.

In March and April our Community Dinners raised two of the largest donations since opening, \$262.00 and \$246.00. This funding helps Grace Center keep the dinners going by paying the rent for the building, purchasing food and supplies for the dinners, and also raises funds for the Food Pantry!

We are so happy to see familiar faces at the dinner as well as new ones each month. Mark your calendar, everyone is welcome!

The Indian Creek Lion's Club donated 75 pounds of food and presented Grace Food Pantry with a check for \$100.00.

Prairie Farms Dairy will be donating milk to the Hoosier Hills Food Bank until the end of May. Providing milk, eggs, and bread every week is one of our goals at the food pantry. This generous gift of Prairie Farms allows Grace Center to purchase other food instead of buying milk. Show your support to Prairie Farms and other companies that share with those in need.





