#### HOOSIER HILLS FOOD BANK

Grace Food Pantry's largest food partner.

Have you ever wondered where Grace Food Pantry gets all the food we distribute? Let us introduce you to Hoosier Hills Food Bank, also known as HHFB.

- A Food Bank is an organization that rescues damaged food that might otherwise be wasted, then redirects that food to those in need. Food Banks are the main collectors of donated food in a community. Working with individuals and community groups on food drives, food banks are the primary contact with food manufactures and distributors. They gather products in quantities that would overwhelm most individual charities. Food Banks then make their collected inventory available to local hunger-related charities.
- Grocery stores, food distributors, food service establishments, and restaurants donate excess, damaged, or unmarketable food that might otherwise be wasted. Community organizations, school classrooms, local churches, and individuals also help keep warehouse inventory stocked through 100 annual food drives.
- HHFB does not sell food, but collects a small maintenance fee from member agencies (such as Grace Center). The type and

quantity of food available varies from week to week at HHFB. On October 12, 2009 Grace Center was allowed 125 pounds of food drive food, filling about 4-5 milk crates. This amount fills 16-20 grocery bags. On Tuesday, October 13, the food pantry distributed 106 bags of groceries!

• HHFB collects, stores, and distributes food products for 94 non-profit organizations which provide free food programs that serve both ill and needy families in six counties. In 2008, Grace Center Food Pantry ranked 23rd in food distribution from HHFB.
